

Port State Control Inspections and targeting process

Course aim and objectives:

This course provides participants with the required knowledge for understanding the Port State Control inspection criteria and MOU regimes to ensure ships are in compliance with the IMO's international regulatory requirements. The course provides guidance for managing and properly preparing for Port State Control inspections and outlines proactive strategies to support ship operators and the ongoing trading of the ship.

Course main elements:

- Background and introduction to Port State Control regime
- Scope of PSC inspections and MOUs
- Targeting of ships for inspection
- PSC types of inspection
- Preparation and management of the PSC inspection
- Findings leading to grounds for detention
- Proactive ship-management reducing the risk for detention
- Class related detention items and corrective actions
- PSC detention consequences and ship-manager appeal process
- Practical exercises and final examination

Course participation:

The course is open to shipping company operations, technical, quality and safety managers, superintendents, masters and ship's officers

Course duration: 2 days
