

Tanker Management & Self-Assessment 3

Course aim and objectives:

Shipping management companies operating any kind of tanker ship, nowadays tend to develop and implement their management systems according to the elements of Tanker Management & Self-Assessment (TMSA), in addition to ISM Code, for satisfying Major Oil Companies standards and in parallel safeguarding commercial benefits and chartering advantages for their fleet. Tanker Management & Self-Assessment was first introduced in 2004 by Oil Companies International Marine Forum (OCIMF) and in 2017, OCIMF's third edition of TMSA was published. This course provides the required knowledge for understanding and implementing the requirements of TMSA 3 as a means for assessing and measuring continual improvement of a company's safety management system, enhancing best practices and promoting safety culture

Course main elements:

- Scope of OCIMF's Tanker Management and Self-Assessment program
- Process of conforming to the TMSA program
- TMSA 3 Elements, KPIs and Best Practice Guidance
- Assessing and measuring continual improvement
- TMSA gap analysis for identifying improvement needs
- Moving from minimum compliance to excellence standards
- Practical exercises and final examination

Course participation:

The course is open to shipping company corporate managers, superintendents, ship-operators and ship-board members involved in the achievement of TMSA KPIs through implementation of continual programs leading to safety and environmental excellence

Course duration: 2 days
